The Residential Colleges

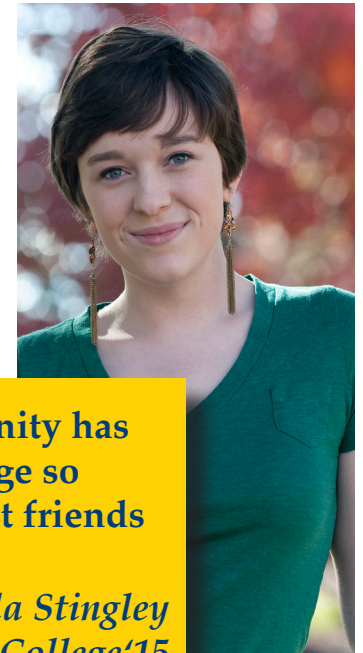
Open to students living on campus who want to live and enroll in courses with their learning community peers as part of UNCG's Residential College tradition.

What does a Learning Community look like?

In most learning communities, students will enroll in common courses (two or three) exploring a theme or major. Additionally, in the Residential Colleges and the Living-Learning Communities, students will live together in the same residence hall to expand their experience even more!



Fall 2012 Learning Community Offerings

UNCG Teach

Open to first-year students majoring in education, this community focuses on preparing future educators for the classroom.

Rites of Passage

Open to first-year and transfer students, this community supports the educational and professional aspirations of male students from traditionally underserved populations.

AToMs: Achieving Together in Mathematics and Science (also available as an LLC option)

Open to first-year students who are majoring in Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics or Physics. This community will feature upperclass mentors, focused study groups and fun.

Exploratory Studies (also available as an LLC option)

Open to first-year students who may be undecided or considering more than one major. Students will "try on" potential majors, while exploring their own interests and potential major choices.

Fall 2012 Living-Learning Community Offerings

AToMs: Achieving Together in Mathematics and Science in Reynolds Hall

Open to first-year students who are majoring in Chemistry, Computer Science, Mathematics or Physics. This community will feature upperclass mentors, focused study groups and fun.

Exploratory Studies in Reynolds Hall

Open to students who may be undecided or considering more than one major. Students will "try on" potential majors, while exploring their own interests and potential major choices.

FYE: First-Year Experience in Reynolds Hall

FYE is open to all first-year students and fosters a close-knit community for students to share and to grow together. FYE offers social and educational opportunities throughout the year.

LEAD: Leaders Emerging and Developing in Cone Hall

The LEAD program provides students interested in leadership with the opportunity to live in a community full of emerging leaders who desire to learn about organizational development, ethics and global leadership.

MADH: Make a Difference House in Moore/Strong Halls

MADH is designed to help UNCG students become active citizens through service-learning, volunteerism, and personal responsibility.

Mosaic in Phillips/Hawkins Halls

Mosaic is open to students of any major interested in expanding their understanding of social justice, multiculturalism, and global citizenship.



Sustainable Entrepreneurship in Jefferson Suites

Open to students majoring or minoring in Entrepreneurship, this community focuses on building and sustaining entrepreneurship in the local community.

Summer Launch in Grogan Hall

Open to students who wish to explore the University and its resources early, this community serves as a summer bridge program that connects students with campus mentors and resources before classes start.

The UNCG Global Village in Phillip/Hawkins Halls

Open to first-year students enrolled in German, French, Italian, Japanese, Russian or Spanish courses in this community. Students will have a wonderful immersion experience exploring language and culture right where they live.

Spartan Wellness (female only) in Weil/Winfield Halls

Spartan Wellness Community is designed for first-year women who would like to develop and practice healthy habits within the residence halls in support of their overall personal wellness and academic success.
