How do I apply to live on campus at UNCG?

Visit the housing website (<http://hrl.uncg.edu>) and look under Apply for Housing. This link will take you to the "New Student 2013-14 Application," with housing information strictly for first-year students.

What do I need to know about meal plans?

Dining Services offers a wide variety of options to choose from based on your classification. For a complete list of meal plans check the website under "Rates and Contracts." Meal plans are required for all students living in the residence halls except for those in Lofts on Lee and Spartan Village, where meal plans are optional.

How and when will I be assigned to a room?

Priority for selecting your room will be based upon:

- 1) Acceptance and placement into a Learning Community,
- 2) Date your application is completed (receipt of application and prepayment),
- 3) Availability of space in the halls you selected on your application.

We assign students as early as mid-March and try to complete the assignment process by mid-July. Early assignments are based on acceptance into a learning community.

Can I sign up to live on campus for only the Fall Semester?

We only offer full academic year contracts. Student who graduate, transfer, or study abroad may be released for the spring semester if they meet the requirements of the 2013-2014 Housing Contract.

What if I want a certain person as my roommate?

Students may select a roommate at the time of submitting the application. Students will need the University ID # of their roommate and will need to make sure that the person being requested as a roommate has also listed them as a roommate request, as only mutual roommate requests will be honored. Students requesting roommates should also make sure that their hall preferences are the same to assist in the assignment process. While roommate requests are not guaranteed, Housing and Residence Life works hard to honor mutual requests.

Why should I apply for housing by May 31, 2012?

YOU WILL BE GUARANTEED A PLACE TO LIVE ON CAMPUS!

If you don't make the May 31 deadline, we will do everything possible to insure you get to live on campus, but we can only GUARANTEE a room assignment if you apply before May 31, 2013!

More residence hall options are available to first-year students who apply to and are accepted by Learning Communities (LCs).

Learning Communities are residential-based programs designed to enhance the overall undergraduate student experience by fostering one-on-one relationships

between faculty, staff, and students in a close knit residence hall environment. Students are encouraged to explore intellectual, cultural, and social interests through experiential activities often linked to the academic curriculum. Students learn with friends, while gaining real-world experience all where they live.
